Promoter's Report on Certificate Course in The Central Law College, Salem

CySI organized a 4 days training programme on cyber laws in India in association with the Central Law College, Salem from 20.03.2017 to 23.03.2017 at the college campus. Shri D.Saravanan, Secretary of the Institution welcomed the gathering and expressed the significance of the programme highlighting the importance of acquiring knowledge on cyber laws and cyber crimes especially for law students. Shri U.P.Prakasham, President, Cyber Society of India inaugurated the training programme. In his inaugural address, he briefly touched upon the past activities of CySI describing Cyber Security Awareness Programmes conducted by CySI and how useful they have been to the society.

During the 4-day course, Mr. V.Rajendran, Past President, Cyber Society of India and the main promoter of the programme, addressed the students on issues like the Information Technology Act, Cyber Security and cyber laws especially on areas like frauds related to ATMs, Internet Banking, and other white collar crimes. He handled sessions on I.T. Act and elaborately touched upon the various cyber crimes, their modus operandi and the legal issues related to offences in the cyber space especially in the area of electronic delivery channels like ATMs, Internet Banking etc. The session on Network Security was handled by Dr B Muthukumaran, Past Joint Secretary of CySI, who introduced the fundamental concepts on network security taking the students through an informative power point presentation on the various crimes associated with Internet and data in transit. Shri R. Sathish Kumar, Advocate from Madras High Court, presented a detailed analysis of Intellectual Property Rights like Copyrights, Trade Marks etc in India, describing the various decided case laws on this subject.

Digital evidences and cyber forensics were covered by lectures and practical sessions on how to take such evidences from electronic gadget, by Shri Vinay Vishwanath from Lab Systems, Mumbai. He also provided many practical inputs and addressed the legal issues on electronic evidences and the practical problems while producing them as evidences in banks. On the concluding day, Shri Rajendran spoke on the compliance issues like RBI guidelines on information security in banks and how the non compliance adversely impact customer service in banks.

The 4-day training was very well received by the students comprising of students of 5-year Law degree and 3-year law degree courses with active participation by some faculty members too, There was an evaluation process at the end of the course with test, viva voce and group discussion conducted and assessed by the CySI Promoter with the college authorities.

Shri P.R. Ramakrishnan, Addl District Judge, Erode was the Chief Guest in the Valedictory function at 3 PM on 23rd March. In his valedictory address, the Judge emphasized the importance of acquiring insight into cyber laws and added that there is an urgent need to set up special cyber courts in the nation. He motivated the students to learn the significance of technology and related laws and said that in future, cyber crimes are going to see an enormous growth in the nation.

The certificate course concluded with certificate distribution with the College Secretary highlighting the success of the programme and the Principal proposing vote of thanks.
